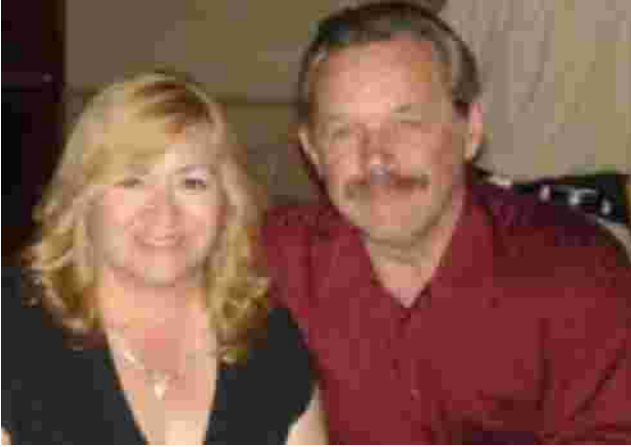

**A Pilot Study of  
Motorcycle  
Crash Causes**

In the *Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)*, Congress directed the Secretary of Transportation to conduct a comprehensive study of the causes of motorcycle crashes. In anticipation of this mandate, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) awarded a contract to conduct a pilot study to develop and test a methodology for in-depth motorcycle crash investigation. The pilot study report, *Motorcycle Crash Causes and Outcomes: Pilot Study*, was released in June 2010.

After negotiating agreements with police agencies in Orange County, California, the plan was to investigate up to 37 crashes during a 3-month period. Only 23 cases were actually completed. Beyond the 23 cases completed, 20 were dropped because there were no rider injuries or there was no cooperation. Keep in mind this was only a pilot study and not meant to analyze crash causes. The data sample was much too limited to be of value for extensive analysis or conclusions.

There were a few interesting bits in the report. There were no GL1800s included in their crash data. The largest engine size reported was less than 1700 cc, so there may have been an older Gold Wing. They did not identify vehicles by make and model. No motorcycle included was equipped with ABS. There were no pedestrians or motorcycle passengers in any of the completed cases. There was no analysis of helmet performance, other than to note that a helmet was worn.

Of the 23 crashes reported, three included fatalities. The report states that the two most frequent crash configurations were, in order, a motorcycle hitting the rear of another vehicle and another vehicle turning left in front of the motorcycle; however, the Case Type table shows that half of the crashes involved only the motorcycle. Almost half of the crashes occurred during daylight hours. Of the riders, seven had less than a year of riding experience. Half of the riders had owned the crashed motorcycle less than a year. Half of the riders had some sort of motorcycle safety training. Nearly all of the involved riders were male. Given that three of the riders were of unknown age, about half of the riders were younger than 40 years, and eight were between 41 and 60 years old. Of the six riders tested for blood alcohol, four were positive, with amounts ranging from 0.12 to 0.19.

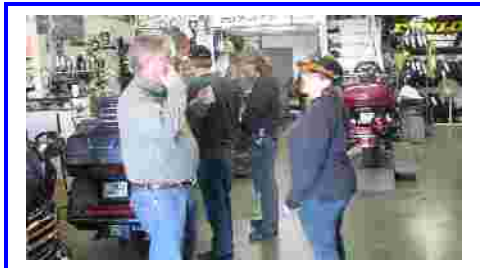
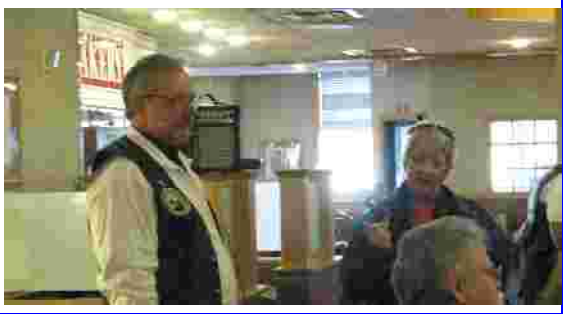

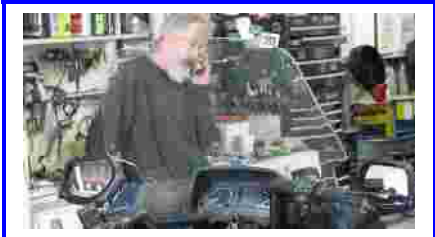
