Protect Yourself from the Sun

"All the gear, all the time," is a common refrain in motorcycle safety discussions. In most of these discussions, the subject is protection from impact. However, there are a couple of unseen threats that make protective clothing a must have.

As the sun comes out and the weather warms we enjoy our rides more. A ride in the country on a sunny day is a happy time; until that evening when we discover we were not adequately shielded from the destructive elements within that sunshine. Our clothing must protect us not only from impact, but also from the heat and ultraviolet radiation on those sunny days.

According to the U.S. National Institutes of Health, ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun is the main cause of skin cancer. The risk of developing skin cancer is also affected by where a person lives. People who live in areas that receive high levels of UV radiation from the sun are more likely to develop skin cancer. For example, people in southern California receive more sun exposure than people in North Dakota.

When you're preparing for that ride, keep these points in mind: (a) Exposure to the sun causes most of the visible changes commonly attributed to aging; and (b) Exposure to UV radiation is suspected in nearly all of the cases of nonmelanoma skin cancers.

Heat is the other major problem affecting our riding in the summer. As we overheat our decision making becomes slower and less accurate, and it becomes more difficult to concentrate on the task of driving. Dehydration is an important concern when out in warm weather.

Our gear can protect us from the effects of UV radiation and from the heat. Shielding the skin will prevent sunburn and reduce the heat generated by sunshine. I wear a neck wrap that when wet cools my neck, but also keeps the sun off. I also carry at least a quart of water on rides. Sometimes I don't need it because I stop and buy drinks, but most of the time I drink at least part of it.

I haven't mentioned sun screen in this article because I feel it's of secondary importance in protection from the sun. Sun screen offers no protection from heat, and only temporarily provides UV filtering. On the other hand, long pants, long sleeves, and gloves provide protection from UV radiation, heat, and minor spills.
