

#### "Watch Your **Back Front'** by Sal Esposito

I had an eye opening experience today [Aug 18]. I had just finished working Sori and Annika on problems in our dog park behind the house in Alabama when I decided to put some things away in the outbuilding adjacent to the dog park.

As I approached the open door I saw the head and about 6 inches of an Eastern Diamond Back rattlesnake on the cement stoop. I was 3 feet from walking in front of it and through the door. I am so glad I was paying attention. I went in the house to retrieve my good ol' off duty 38 wheel gun and loaded it with snake shot. Hey, I got dogs

When I got back to the scene the rattlesnake was in the out building, but near the door. I dispatched it with two shots – I thought. It was still moving and rattling. I used a rake to drag it outside of the out building. I shot it one more time in the back of the head. It was still moving and rattling. Oy.....

Caution is advised even when snakes are believed to be dead; rattlesnake heads can see, flick the tongue, and inflict poisonous bites for up to an hour after being severed from the body


We have them in the wilderness in CA too. We came across one on the south county search.

Travels to Wing Ding, part deux (2),

Last we chatted, June 26th, Sandy and I were in San Antonio, the Alamo, and the River Walk. Well, we were just getting started on our adventure. Here's more of the story...

Monday, June 27th, we had a short ride from S.Antonio down to Corpus Christi, Tx. Spent the afternoon at the USS Lexington ship and museum, then headed out to Padre Island for a campsight. Nice spot – no other campers - or showers or water though. Found they were releasing baby Ridley turtles early Tuesday morning. Sandy was ecstatic, and no way we could leave without seeing that. Camped the next night at Galvaston State Beach. Nothing fancy. We sat on the beach for awhile, read our books, and had a cold one. Next day we set out, following the gulf coast as much as possible. 2 ferry rides and lots of water on our right. A good road along Cameron, with lots of foundations (only) left from Katrina. Guess they haven't rebuilt yet. Some were, but many more just rubble. Humbling. Also had an encounter with traffic and several empty 5 gal water jugs. I stopped quickly enough to avoid hitting any cars, but managed to kick the bucket – literally, one of the jugs bounded towards us and I kicked it out of the way with my left foot! Who says riding a motorcycle isn't entertaining? Then to add to the fun, we had a nice lunch in Abbeville, La, and about ready to leave, and notice it's pouring rain outside. So we decide to have a refill on our tea, and see what happens. Seemed to stop and we left ~ 1/2 hour later. Unfortunately, our route would've taken us further into the storm, so we bailed and drove the 4-lane towards New Orleans. Still got caught in 2 good downpours, but made it ok. Spent the next 2 nights at Segnette State Park in Westwego just outside New Orleans. Abit challenging to find as they were repairing the levies and the road was torn up (aka dirt/gravel). Next morning we unhooked the trailer and rode into New Orleans. Got tickets for the Natchex Steamboat tour and walked around the French Quarter. Nice lunch, pictures, and walk around town. Sandy insisted we have a beignet at Café Du Mondo and of course it was on the other side of downtown. More walkabout...Found a local restaurant for dinner and had a wonderful southern fish dinner. Friday, we took off for Natchez, Miss. to pick up the Natchez Trace Parkway. Nice, easy riding with trees side to side and hanging over the pkwy. Should be 150 mph speed, then would be fun. Bailed off the parkway for Memphis and Graceland on Saturday. Sunday, we took some nice backroads to Nashville and a tour of Opryland in the afternoon. Got a KOA for the night and had a nice visit with our neighbors. Two couples from Canada on their way to Wing Ding also. Compared tent stories.













#### WingDing Trip Week 3

Monday, July 4, we moved down the road about \( \frac{1}{2} \) mile to Jellystone Campground. This was the only reservation we had for the trip due to July 4th possibly being filed up. It wasn't, and we could've stayed at either campground for 2 nights. Took a bus into Nashville for their street festival and fireworks. Outstanding fireworks. Right over the Cumberland River. You could feel the concussion from the fireworks. It was great. But there was lots of congestion, the bus couldn't pick us up right away, and we got back to camp around midnight. Tuesday we stopped at Oakridge, Tn and learned all about the Manhattan Project (atomic bomb). The gov't took over the acreage they needed, displacing the ranchers, and built the town, worksite, etc. in less than 12 months. Amazing.. We relaxed the next 5 nights at the Crowne Plaza hotel in Knoxville and enjoyed Wing Ding. The convention center was ~ 8 blocks easy walk from the hotel, thru the Market Plaza which had food, shops, ice cream, and occasional entertainment. Wednesday's opening ceremony filled the main auditorium at the convention center. Not sure how many made it, but at the end, the registered attendance was 12368. Met up with Doug Loyd, also from San Jose and our chapter, early and saved a spot. Some staying in outlying areas had bus delays and travel/parking problems and didn't make it in time for the pre-registration raffle. We didn't win anything. We hit the trade show later that morning, had lunch on the Market Plaza, more tradeshow in the afternoon, and then met up with Doug for dinner. Walked down to Calhoun's, right on the Tennessee River, and enjoyed a great meal. Then walked back through town and found a place to watch the light parade of wings and trikes. Most were well lit up and very colorful. Had a gellato, and said fairwell to Doug for the night. Next morning back at the convention center and the vendors. Danny was looking for a replacement mesh jacket and Sandy a new helmet. Lots of shopping. In the afternoon, Danny took the ARC classroom portion, and Sandy took the bus to the Expo at Chilhowee Park for more shopping. We met back up for the J&M sponsored BBQ dinner and show along with Doug. Johnny Counterfeit performed and was very funny and entertaining. Friday morning did more helmet fitting and shopping at the vendor booths, then headed off for the ARC riding portion about 30 miles away at the Blount Sheriff's training ground. The course was all set up, and after checking in, t-clocs, and introductions, we got underway. Everything was fine until it started raining, then lightning, and we paused and waited under the covered picnic area. It was pretty warm out, so it was the lightning mainly of concern. Wet and warm no problem, and we finished a bit behind schedule. We wanted to catch the team riding, but after having dinner didn't make it in time to Chilhowee Park. The live entertainment, Blues Brothers impersonators, was wrapping up as most folks were leaving. And we headed back to the hotel as well. Saturday was shopping judgment day. Settled on a helmet for Sandy and jacket for Danny as well as some additional miscellaneous items. Took in several of the workshops – co-rider, trailering, and Going, going, gone (trip packing). Lunch on the Plaza, then back to pick up Sandy's helmet w/headset. Met up with Doug for closing ceremonies and raffles. None of us won anything, including the new 2012 Goldwing. And then off to dinner at Calhoun's again (yes it was that good). Said our goodbyes, as Doug was headed on to visit relatives for a few days before returning home. Sunday we hung around the hotel in the morning. Danny was frantically finishing his planning for the 2nd half of the trip, downloading the routes to Jacque so Sandy could take the laptop back, and Sandy was packing. We parted at the airport around 2PM for Sandy's return flight home. Danny was now riding solo, grabbed some supplies, and headed out a town. Missed going down the Tail of the Dragon, but went nearby through Gatlingburg (tourist town) and started up the Blue Ridge parkway. Breathtaking views with numerous turnouts and photo ops. Came upon a fresh down tree blocking the road and a scraped up Harley and rider/co-rider. They were unfortunate enough to come around the corner and have the tree drop in front of them. They slid to a stop and were ok, regrouped, and now decided enough excitement and were headed back to town. I was following an 1800 about this time, with co-rider, and single wheel trailer, keeping up nicely with them, when I think he got distracted sightseeing, went into the grass on the side of the road and recovered just in time to miss the wall to the upcoming tunnel. Stopped in the on-coming lane, regrouped and split. Didn't see them again, but I bet the co-rider was giving him an earful. Nice save btw. Was getting foggy, misty and late into the evening and the 1st campground I came to was full. So on down the road to Crabtee Falls State Campground. Nice place. Rained a bit during the night, and the morning was misty and the mountains had fog/clouds covering them.









#### WingDing Trip Week 4

Monday, July 11, I got an early start and almost hit some wild turkeys on the road right off. The Blue Ridge parkway was much more enjoyable than the Natchez. More turns and more scenic. Got off the Blue Ridge after a hundred miles or so and headed north for Detroit. Ugh, got on a tollroad across Ohio, then hit rain in Ripley, and got soaked before getting the raingear on. Possible hotel was a bust and I was still wet. Jacque sent me on a wild ride - sloppy, gravel road to Strouds Run state campground that was very isolated, near Athens, OH. Worked out just fine though as I had everything I needed, it wasn't raining, and I was quite ready to stop for the night. Went to bed about 10, and then the fireworks began. Lightning and thunder in the distance, and getting closer. Within the hour it was pouring rain, with lightning to light up the tent, and thunder to rock 'er. Tent had a couple leaks, but I've had worse, and the next morning, Tues, had an easy ride up to Milan, MI. Visited with a couple other wingers along the way and (finally) found a campground. Jacque again sent me on a scenic tour of the area. I unhooked the trailer and went into town for shopping, laundry, and a local pizza joint for dinner. Wednesday I went sightseeing back in Ohio to Port Clinton and Marblehead Lighthouse on Lk Erie. Took a little walk on the shore and got my feet wet, but it was a bit choppy, windy and cool. Found some good country roads back to camp for a swim and home cooked meal. The night temps were cooling off, and I leisurely packed and headed out Thursday to meet an old work friend in Westland (Detroit area). Had a great visit with him and his wife, she fixed a fab lunch, and I got a list of things to see in Sault St Marie (Upper Peninsula part of Michigan). I left their home around 3PM and headed up the 4 lane a bit before turning off to follow along Lk Michigan. I found a KOA in Oscoda for the night, and had a nice visit with a BMW guy from Bellingham, WA, on his way to the BMW rally in Penn. Next morning, Friday, I had my first driving boo-boo. Decided too late to make a right turn, didn't slow down enough, went wide, and the front wheel hit loose gravel and down I went. Not a good place to stop, so I got the bike up, restarted, and drove on a couple miles and found a good stopping place. My right sleeve jacket and shirt slid up and I got a little road rash on my forearm. No damage to the bike or rest of me. A little first aid, bike and trailer checked over ok, and back on my way. Continued the scenic route along Lk Michigan, across Macanac Bridge, and into Sault St Marie. Decided it was time for a new front tire, and got directions to the only likely source, a local Honda motorcycle shop. They had the tire, but the service department was booked. They let me take it off and back on in their parking lot and they mounted/balanced the tire for me. Lucky, started at 2 and done by 4. Following my friends recommendation, I had a juicy buffalo burger at Clyde's. Then found a campground along the river, and had Friday Night fish dinner at the Elks lodge within walking distance. Saturday morning I took the lock tour (boat ride), and it went thru the locks from Lk Superior to Lk Michigan, into Canadian waters, and back. Alot like many locks, this one 26 feet difference between the lakes. Mostly for hauling steel making materials with a large steel plant on the Canadian side. Lunch at Clyde's again, and afterwards I tooled up north to Paradise, to the Shipwreck Museum (Gordon Lightfoots famous song SS Fitzgerald) and a walk in Lk Superior. Had a fish dinner in Paradise on the way to Monistique, MI before dark. The campground was nice, and located near the NW corner of Lk Michigan. Killed a lot of mosquitos this night and didn't sleep very well. Little buggers just came right in tenaciously. Up anyway, so got an early start Sunday. This was pretty much a travel day across Wisconsin and into Minnesota. I did take very nice 2 lane roads and the scenery was nice. WI was very forested, and most homes I saw along the roadways, had 2 or more riding mowers standing by or in use. In MN the scenery changed to mostly farms. Miles of grassland with bales of hay, some corn, but mostly looked like cattle feed. Rolled into St. Cloud, MN and took a lap through town looking for a hotel and food. The town's located on both sides of the Mississippi River. I'd also decided it was time for a new rear tire about now, so that was a consideration. Jacque found the Honda dealer, and a hotel nearby. So I went for a swim in the pool, then off to a dinner buffet I'd spotted. I pulled out the Gold Book, hoping to get some local input on where to go for a tire. Called 2 guys in St Cloud area, talked with one, and he gave me some suggestions.




